Scope of position Key responsibilities	DAS secondary teachers are responsible for planning, preparing and delivering high standards of instruction that result in ever-increasing student performance against international benchmarks. They are also responsible for creating a physical and emotional environment for students that is safe, supportive, motivating and in all ways conducive to learning. To be a successful DAS classroom teacher, you should be able to create an environment that is welcoming to students from different backgrounds and cultures. Ultimately, an exceptional classroom teacher will encourage students to interact with each other to improve their English-speaking skills, to adopt an inquisitive and creative approach to their learning, and to encourage and motivate students to explore the world around them. This teacher will be asked to collaborate with other disciplines, specifically to infuse language into content area learning. This teaching position will support collaboration and communication with teachers knowledgeable in the development of the DAS curriculum.
